From our studies this far, we have seen that the heart of the Gospel is the good news that, "Christ died for our sins,": In this single phrase we have summarized the facts God wants us to know and accept - that is (1) That we are sinners (2) That the penalty of sin is death (3) That Jesus Christ, through the shedding of His blood on the cross, paid this penalty for us.

Christ has done everything that is necessary for salvation; it is for this reason that the one thing that God commands us to do if we are to receive His salvation is: "... Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ..." Acts 16:31

But some will say, "I believe already." However, the word "believe" as used in the Bible, does not mean simply a mental assent to certain facts of doctrine, but rather, a complete trust in a Person. To believe in Jesus Christ in the Biblical sense, then, is something quite different from believing about Napoleon. It is an act of the will, and not of the intellect only.
